

THURSDAY, DECEMBER 16, 1869

The Board of Aldermen met at the Court House this evening at candle light. Present: Mayor Deberry, Aldermen Armstrong, Boon, Frazier, McAllister and Wilson – Recorder Watkins and Marshal Nichols.

Alderman Armstrong from the committee on the survey reported a complete survey of the Town, which is adopted and ordered to be entered on the minutes, to wit:

Beginning at a Hickory on the bank of the Forked Deer River in the bend above Sternes Brothers Saw Mill; running thence northeast to a marked White Oak near John E. Roberts' south fence; thence west 5 degrees East to the South West corner of McKenzies' lot; thence North to a stake in Mrs. Phillips' field; thence North 85 degrees West (passing South of Mrs. Phillips' house) to a White Oak tree near Troy Road; thence passing through the North West corner of W. M. Watkins' house to the middle of the lane west of Levi Sternes' house; thence South with said lane (pass west of Mrs. Fowlkes through the west side of her smoke house) on to a Cypress on the bank of Forked Deer River; thence up the river with its meander to the Beginning.
