

**BOARD MINUTES**  
**Wednesday, January 24, 1872**  
**Court House**

The Mayor and Aldermen met at the Court House. Present: Mayor Clark, Aldermen Deberry, Miller, McAllister, Pinner, Roberts and Sampson.

On motion Alderman Miller was appointed as the representative of this Board to attend the evening meeting for the election of Directors for the Mississippi River Railway in Memphis; and \$25.00 was appropriated for his expenses.

On motion it was ordained that every man refusing to aid the Marshal to make arrest when summoned be punished by fine at the Mayor's discretion.

On motion J.H. Kelley was allowed \$4.20 jailer's fees. The Marshal was ordered to publish the regulations by hand bills put up all over Town.

The Mayor was directed to retain Mr. Skeffington to defend the suits of Webb and Child and I.F. Child.

On motion it was voted that it is and always has been lawful for the Marshal to kill a proud slut running at large in Town. Adjourned.
