

BOARD MEETING
Saturday, July 6, 1872
Court House

The Board of Mayor and Aldermen met at the Court House this evening a candle light – Present: Mayor Clark, Aldermen Deberry, McAllister, Miller, Pinner and Sampson.

The minutes of the last meeting were read, approved and ordered to be signed.

The committee on the “Fire Extinguisher” were allowed further time to report.

The Mayor reported to the Board of Aldermen that the people of the Town of Dyersburg by a vote of voters 126 to two votes have authorized the Mayor and Aldermen to subscribe \$50,000 to the capital stock of the Paducah & Memphis Railroad Company on the terms and conditions of the Ordinance of June 5, 1872. Which Report as well as one copy of the Poll Books of said election is ordered to be filed with the Corporation papers and one copy of the Poll Books be filed with the County Court Clerk.

On motion of Ald. Miller it is ordered that a tax of one dollar each be levied on dogs in town, and that each dog taxed shall wear a collar to protect him from the Marshal and his assistants who may kill any dog they find running at large in Town without collars.

Ald. Pinner was authorized to fix the culvert in front of his property and bring in the bill.

In pursuance of the Ordinance passed by this Board on the 5th day of June 1872, which has been duly satisfied by the legal majority of the qualified voters of the Town of Dyersburg at the election to-day, on motion it is ordered by unanimous consent that the Mayor be authorized to subscribe \$50,000 at once to the capital stock of the Paducah and Memphis Railroad Company on the terms and conditions of said Ordinance.

On motion the Board adjourned.
