At call meeting of Board of Mayor and Aldermen following ordinance was passed:

Resolved that the ordinance passed by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen on 5th of December 1881 in regard to erection of framed buildings on or near the square of the Town of Dyersburg be so ascended as to read as follows and thus shall be no wood frame or wooden buildings built on the square or on any of the streets leading from the square, nor shall any frame or wooden building be surround to any lot on square or any street leading from the square for the distance of one hundred and twenty feet from the square.

Mayor was ordered to enjoin the putting frame houses within the fire limits and especially to prevent Burk from putting a frame house on his lot.

Board of Mayor and Aldermen met at Court House for Town of Dyersburg on September 5, 1882.

Present Mayor Thomas, Aldermen W. E. DeBerry, Ed Smith, A. M. Stevens, Jno. W. Nichols and W. R. Hayes and Marshal Nichols.

Minutes of last meeting read and signed.

Report of committee to settle with Recorder and Marshall received and discharged as found – warrants issued

On motion two & 50/100 dollars for pump handle allowed Jno. Sawyers.

On motion account A. W. Stevens \$23.50 allowed

On motion account Brown Wells & Co. \$8.50 allowed

On motion Jno. W. Nichols was appointed to hold election to ascertain the wants of the people on a hog law.

On motion it was ordered that a pavement be built around the public square and that each property owner be assessed to pay for same in front of his property and that a tax

receipt be given him for amount paid – receivable by Corporation only on taxes due on paid property.

Jno. Nichols, Ed. Smith and W. E. DeBerry on motion were appointed to see what was needed on street north of Mr. Pinner's. Ordinance on motion taxes for 1882 was assessed at .50 cents on \$100.00.

On motion adjourned till meeting in October.
