BOARD MEETING May 1, 1883 Court House

Board of Mayor and Aldermen for Town of Dyersburg met at Court House on

Tuesday night May 1, 1883.

Present Mayor B. L. Thomas, Aldermen A. B. Jones, Z. G. Watkins, J. W. Baker, J.

C. Pinner, Ed Smith, W. R. Hayes and Marshall Thurmond.

Minutes of last meeting approved and signed.

On motion report of committee on side walk from E. S. Thurmond to E. C. Pate's was read and discharged, and on motion account of J. A. Atkins for seventeen and 25/100 dollars for building said walk allowed.

On motion Ed Smith was appointed to settle with E. C. Pate for his portion of walk running from Sampson's corner to said Pate's residence.

On motion account in favor Jackson & Nichols allowed - \$50.38.

On motion committee to settle with J. W. Nichols allowed further time. (Hayes, Pinner & Smith) On motion committee to settle with Latta & Marshall allowed further time, Watkins & Smith.

On motion account in favor T. W. Neal for thirteen dollars (\$13.00) allowed.

On motion account in favor J. P. Freeman for four & 60/100 allowed. (\$4.60)

On motion account in favor Jack Kohnnam .30 cents allowed.

On motion account in favor Parr Nolen & Co. for (.20) twenty cents allowed.

On motion account in favor J. W. Brown & Co. for twenty two & 95/100 dollars allowed.

On motion Edmund Smith was elected Deputy Marshal for balance of year 1883 for Town of Dyersburg and was duly sworn into office by J. C. Pinner J. P. for County. On motion Dr. W. H. Tucker, T. J. King and R. N. Butterworth was allowed to build brick walks on their respective corners and the Corporation issue each of them tax receipt for amount of cost on same, said receipts to be taken ref on taxable property within Corporation of Dyersburg provided that amt. allowed shall only be for pavement running length of the buildings.

On motion, the ordinance declaring hogs running at large within the Corporation limits a nuisance, the same be, and is hereby repealed from and after this date the public requiring it.

On motion buggies and wagons were permitted to stand in front of property on the square provided parties owning the property do not object and not more than 10 feet in front is occupied. On motion J. P. Thurmond and Edmund Smith were appointed beef inspectors for Town of Dyersburg and ordered to see that no beef is offered for sale within the Corporation until inspected.

On motion Board adjourned.
