

**BOARD MEETING**

**July 1, 1884**

**Court House**

**Board of Mayor and Aldermen met in regular session on Tuesday night, July 1, 1884 at Court House.**

**Present Mayor Thomas, Aldermen J. C. Pinner, J. W. Baker, A. B. Jones, Ed Smith and W. R. Hayes and Marshall Thurmond.**

**Minutes of last meeting were read, approved and signed.**

**Committee on walk to colored M. E. Church and Mrs. Wright reported work finished and on motion committee was discharged.**

**Committee on opening street to Fowlkes lane and buying the ground of Mr. Vaughn, reported that they would not advise the purchase of ground for purpose of opening street which report on motion was read and committee discharged.**

**On motion fifty dollars was allowed the Bowl factory July 1, 1884 and fifty dollars on January 1, 1885 same to be secured by Mr. Jones to Corporation by a mortgage and if the factory is kept for two years in operation in Dyersburg, then at the end of the two years the one hundred dollars becomes a donation, but if not kept in operation, and not run for two years in Dyersburg, said one hundred dollars to be refunded.**

**On motion committee on cemetery fence allowed further time to make report.**

**On motion accounts in favor of:**

**7/3 – W. E. DeBerry - \$4.77**

**7/4 – A. W. Stevens - \$93.98**

**allowed and ordered paid.**

**On motion lumber to build walk from Troy Street to Dr. Tucker's residence was allowed provided Dr. Tucker would furnish nails and have the walk put down without cost to Corporation.**

**On motion Z. Watkins, A. B. Jones and J. C. Pinner were appointed to examine and if W. C. Doyles' estate had been assessed too much personally for 1883 to make the proper correction and at the same time to examine and if any had not been assessed who should be, to report the same for assessment.**

**On motion J. W. Baker was allowed ten dollars for services rendered on finance committee.**

**On motion Ed Smith, Pinner and Hayes were appointed to settle with Jim Nichols.**

**On motion Board adjourned.**
